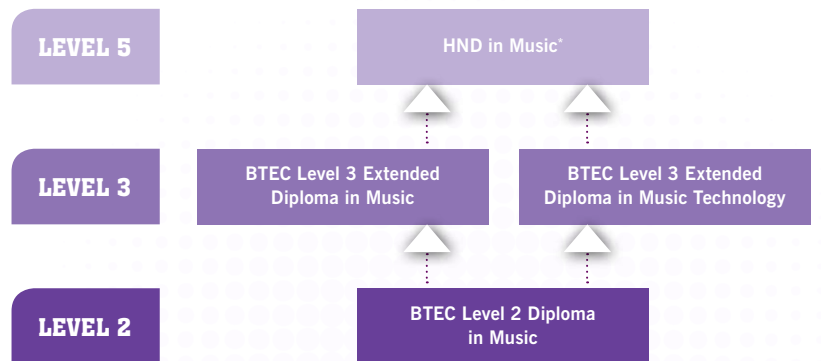
BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma in Music

BTEC Level 2 Diploma in Music

1 year full-time, equivalent to 4 GCSEs at grade C or above

Are you a musician who has been playing for a year or two? Do you want to develop your skills and experience further? Are you interested in furthering your qualification profile, with a view to progressing on to a higher level course of study? If so, the BTEC Level 2 Diploma is for you.

This course is designed to develop a range of musical skills, while at the same time developing academic and personal skills that will enhance your employability and ability to progress to further study. There is an opportunity to re-sit GCSE Mathematics or English for those who have achieved a grade D at GCSE.

Assessment:

This is a practical, work-related course. You learn by completing a range of exciting projects and assignments based on situations and demands relevant to working as a musician. By completing projects, you will gain grades for the various units and an overall grade for the qualification is awarded at the end of the year. Projects include organising and playing at a number of public performances, sequencing using music technology and theory-based work. Attendance and application to all areas is essential for successful completion.

To join the course:

You will need at least:

- 2 GCSEs at grade D or above including English Language

Mature students without formal qualifications who show a convincing level of musical skill, such that you will be able to manage the demands of the course, will be considered.

In addition you will also need to be able to demonstrate your commitment to the course by:

- Attending an interview
- Providing an acceptable reference
- Attending an audition (if you fail to attend the audition you will not be considered for the course). Details will be sent to you following a successful interview or can be found on the website.

Further opportunities:

BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma in Music

2 years full-time, equivalent to 3 A Levels

Are you interested in a career in music and want to increase your skills in playing, performing and composing? Do you want to study in a stimulating Performing Arts environment with a variety of music professionals and practitioners? If so, then the BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma offers a comprehensive music education for the practical contemporary musician and is the course for you.

This course is for students who want to develop their performance skills and take part in performance projects. The course is based around the performance of a variety of musical styles in a range of exciting industry-based contexts developing performance, playing skills, improvisation and composition. It is supported by skills development in areas such as the Music industry and the development of popular music as well as some music technology.

Assessment:

This is a practical, work-related course. You learn by completing a range of exciting projects and assignments based on situations and demands relevant to working in the Music industry. You will gain grades for the various units and an overall grade for the qualification is awarded at the end of the two years.

Projects include organising and playing at a number of public performances, sequencing and composing using music technology and composing for orchestra.

To join the course:

You will need at least:

- 4 GCSEs at grade C or above, which must include English Language and preferably Music and Mathematics

or

- BTEC Level 2 Diploma in Music (or other relevant subject) with an overall merit profile, plus GCSE English at grade C or above

and

- A proven musical background

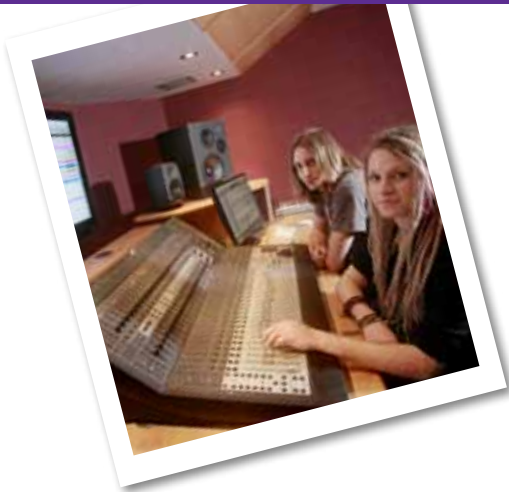

BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma in Music Technology

2 years full-time, equivalent to 3 A Levels

Are you interested in a career in music and want to increase your skills in recording and music technology? Do you want to study in a stimulating environment with a variety of music professionals and practitioners? If so, then the BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma in Music Technology is for you.

This course is for students who are musically motivated and play a musical instrument, but are more interested in studio work 'on the other side of the desk'. You will focus on recording using Logic and Pro Tools software and completing a range of studio-based recording projects which will, from time to time, utilise playing and composition skills too. You will also learn about, and be responsible for, operating live sound for Music Department performances. This is supported by skills development in a range of important areas such as the development of popular music, music performance session styles and the Music industry.

Assessment:

This is a practical, work-related course. You learn by completing a range of exciting projects and assignments based on situations and demands relevant to working in the field of music technology. You will gain grades for the various units and an overall grade for the qualification is awarded at the end of the year. Projects undertaken during this course include organising and undertaking a number of recording sessions, composing and recording commissioned songs and operating live sound.

To join the course:

You will need at least:

- 4 GCSEs at grade C or above, which must include English Language and preferably Music and Mathematics
- or
- BTEC Level 2 Diploma in Music (or other relevant subject) with an overall merit profile, plus GCSE English at grade C or above
