NCFE Level 2 Certificate in Developing Skills for Working With Children and Young People

Who is the Course Aimed at?

Adults working with children and young people as well as those interested in working in the childcare sector.

Key objectives

- To develop a basic knowledge and understanding of the needs of children and young people, aged 0-19 years, in a variety of childcare settings.
- To understand their role in supporting development of children and young people.

Course Content

- Develop self professionally and personally
- Contribute to the provision of equal opportunities for children and young people
- Contribute to maintaining a safe environment for children and young people
- Provide a range of appropriate activities for children and young people

NCFE Level 2 Safeguarding Children and Young People

Who is the Course Aimed at?

Anyone who works in an environment where there is direct contact with children.

Key Objectives

- To develop awareness of legal procedural frameworks and roles and responsibilities for keeping records and reporting appropriately.
- To develop self-knowledge and recognise own role in taking considered action.

Course Content

- Explore and understand roles in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people
- Understand legislation and policies which safeguard children and young people
- Develop personal skills to effectively contribute to the safeguarding of children and young people

NCFE Level 2 Certificate in Equality and Diversity

Who is the Course Aimed at?

Those who want to develop their knowledge of equality and diversity, aid employment opportunities and for those already employed as part of their continuous professional development.

Key Objectives

- To raise the issues surrounding equality and diversity
- Demonstrate this awareness through their actions in the home, community and workplace

Course Content

The course consists of three units:

- Explore equality and diversity
- Explore prejudice and discrimination
- Explore people's rights and responsibilities

NCFE Level 2 Certificate in Infection Control

Who is the Course Aimed at?

Those who wish to develop a knowledge of infection control and those wishing to access or complement other programmes. The minimum age of entry for this qualification is 16.

Key Objectives

- An understanding of the meaning and importance of infection control and the laws that surround it.
- An awareness of infection control methods and how infection control is managed in England
- Knowledge of what infections are and how they can be caught, spread, fought and prevented
- An awareness of the importance of personal health and hygiene and food hygiene.

NCFE Level 2 Certificate for Non-Care Workers in a Care Setting

Who is the Course Aimed at?

For non care workers in a statutory, private and voluntary care settings.

Staff who regularly communicate and interact with service users who do not provide direct personal care. The qualification is likely to be of particular relevance to staff contemplating a transition into a social care role who want to increase their understanding before taking this step. The qualification will also be suitable for learners who intend to take up or return to employment in an ancillary role.

Key Objectives

- Recognise the barriers to effective communication in care and how to overcome these
- Understand the values underpinning care
- Identify the skills required to communicate and work effectively as a team within the care setting
- Understand how to resolve potentially challenging situations they may encounter

First Aid

Community First Aid

Who is the Course Aimed at?

The Community First Aid course is designed to train members of the public that require basic first aid skills.

Course Content

- Introduction: Principles of First Aid
- Scene Safety
- Chain of Survival
- Scene Survey
- Emergency Management Procedure Exposure Protection
- Barrier Devices
- Basic Life Support
- Primary Survey & Reassessment
- Clearing the Airway
- Alternative Ventilation Procedures
- Choking Adult
- Life Threatening Conditions
- Severe Bleeding
- Shock Management

Students will practice the essential skills in small groups and will apply these skills in scenario sessions during the course.

Sports Aid First Course

The Sports First Aid course meets the recommendations of the HSE Health and Safety at Work (1981) Regulations for Appointed Persons in the Workplace.

Course Content

This course will also provide participants with the opportunity to gain fundamental knowledge and skills in order to recognise and manage common injuries sustained in sports and provide immediate "non-emergency" first aid care.

Babysitting First Aid

Who is the Course Aimed at?

Anyone who cares for young children while their parents are absent

Key Objectives

- To enable you to recognise and deal with emergency situations involving children
- To ensure your own safety whilst babysitting

Course Content

- Danger awareness - getting help
- Child and baby resuscitation
- Care of unconscious person
- Asthma choking
- Bleeding burns
- Fractures head injuries

Course outcome

- To feel confident to recognise and deal with emergencies involving children
- To improve the qualities of a good babysitter

First Aid Update

The following changes to first aid training will come into effect **1st October 2009**:

First Aid at Work will now be taught over three days.

A new HSE approved one day course, **Emergency First Aider in the Workplace**, will replace the current Appointed Person course. The two day re-qualification will not be changed.

The HSE recommend that all students attend a 3 hour annual skills update at the end of their first and second year.

All current certificates are valid until their expiry date.



Emergency First Aider in the Workplace

Who is the Course Aimed at?

Anybody required to undertake the responsibilities of an appointed first aider within their workplace

Key Objectives

- To develop an awareness of the responsibilities of an appointed first aider

Course Content

- Recognising life threatening situations
- Getting appropriate help
- Resuscitation
- Unconsciousness
- Choking
- Serious illnesses
- Bleeding
- Skeletal injuries
- Burns
- Shock
